SINGAPORE — On 24 February 2024, the National University Health System (NUHS) celebrates the vital role caregivers play in healthcare with its inaugural **NUHS Caregivers' Day**. The event will be held at Ng Teng Fong General Hospital, and is expected to bring together nine partner organisations and over 100 caregivers with the aim of uplifting and empowering caregivers, recognising the sacrifices they make for the people they cherish.

From a dedicated husband who ingeniously devised a new way to communicate with his wife amidst her struggle with a debilitating autoimmune condition, to a foreign domestic worker who selflessly spent over a decade caring for her older employers as if they were her own parents until their final days, the **NUHS Caregiver Awards 2024** spotlights their remarkable empathy, resilience and strength. Their stories underscore the pivotal role that caregivers play in care delivery, by being an active partner and offering critical feedback to the care team.
